OUR TOP INDUSTRIES



Agriculture

There are approximately 276,000 acres of arable land cultivated in the region. With most farms being mixed use ranching and grain production. Dry land farming is most common and accounts for approximately 177,000 acres of cultivated land. Another 1,200 acres are irrigated. The average farm has approximately 1,500 acres and 75 head of cattle and grain production accounts for a large percentage of acreage use.



Oil and Gas

Highway 41 is a major distribution route leading to major oil and gas developments in the oil sands and runs directly through the MD of Acadia. Additionally, major and secondary paved highways supplement the area. Our region is ideally situated for oil and gas industry transportation and servicing. In addition, the region is well served by pipeline corridors with enviable utility and communications service.



Tourism

Tourism is a significant growth industry for the MD of Acadia. As a community within the Canadian Badlands, we boast several prospects for tourism entrepreneurs. The Canadian Badlands is a destination choice for hundreds of thousands of tourists each year. In addition, the region is full of history, museums, scenery, fishing holes and campgrounds to attract both visitors and new tourism enterprises.



Transportation

The MD of Acadia is located in southeastern Alberta approximately 150 kilometres north of the City of Medicine Hat. Highway 41 runs north and south through the region and is a major distribution route. Connecting highways include Highways 570 and 562. Residents have access to air strips in the neighbouring towns of Oyen and Empress with the nearest freight and passenger service available in Medicine Hat.
