Oil and Gas

The energy sector continues to be a key driver of employment and economic growth in the community, supporting a range of oil and gasrelated businesses, services, and contractors in the Village and surrounding areas.



Agriculture

Farms in the Consort region have expanded and diversified to include both traditional grains such as wheat, oats, and barley; and also canola, peas, lentils, flax and corn. Farmers and ranchers in the area also benefit from the support of the Chinook Applied Research Association (CARA), which provides valuable resources, field trials, and research to help optimize crop production, improve soil management, and enhance livestock operations.



Renewable Energy

The energy sector has expanded to include renewable energy, with the Sharp Hills Wind Project, located south of town, playing a significant role in diversifying the region's energy landscape. This development strengthens the local economy while contributing to long-term sustainability.



Transportation

Consort is strategically located to key transportation routes. Highway 12 runs east-west, while Highway 41 provides a vital north-south connection. Additionally, the community is part of the Eastern Alberta Trade Corridor, supporting regional and international trade. The local airstrip features a 3,000-foot paved and lighted runway, a weather station, and access to the GPS instrument approach at the Oyen Airport. The nearest commercial and air freight services are in Edmonton. Nearby rail services provide an efficient shipping option, with goods easily transported by truck via Highway 41 to and from the rail network.
